

FACTS	WHAT DOES AMERIPRISE NATIONAL TRUST BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Social Security number and income ▪ Assets and transaction history ▪ Credit history and investment expertise <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Ameriprise National Trust Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

How does Ameriprise National Trust Bank protect my personal information?	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.</p> <p>For more information on how we protect your personal information go to http://www.ameriprise.com/privacy</p>
How does Ameriprise National Trust Bank collect my personal information?	<p>We collect your personal information, for example, when</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ An account is opened or we receive or disburse assets ▪ An insurance application is completed or when a new investment advisory contract is established ▪ You tell us about your investment or retirement portfolio <p>We also collect your personal information from others, such as to prepare tax returns in our fiduciary capacity.</p>
Why can't I limit all sharing?	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes – information about your creditworthiness ▪ Affiliates from using your information to market to you ▪ Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>

Definitions	
Affiliates	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Our affiliates include companies with an Ameriprise, RiverSource, Columbia Threadneedle or American Enterprise name; financial companies such as banks, broker-dealers, asset managers and insurance companies</i>
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Ameriprise National Trust Bank does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</i>
Joint marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Ameriprise National Trust Bank does not have any joint marketing partners.</i>
